Seasons of life vary so dramatically throughout the years. In this season of my life, I am teaching my youngest son to drive, baking a 1st birthday cake for my 3rd granddaughter, and caring for my mother-in-law who suffers from Alzheimer's. It is a crazy, confusing, but blessed kind of season. Juggling it all is not easy, nor is it always enjoyable, but God has given me a core belief that serving others, wherever and however that may be, is a natural part of what Christ followers are called to do. And it is a quality I learned from my mother.

Growing up in a family of six, we had a busy house. Despite the mounds of laundry, dishes, and house work, I watched as my mom cooked for sick neighbors, baked for those suffering loss, and cared for our aging relatives. Never once do I remember hearing a complaint. In fact, I distinctly remember a sense of joy in her that others could not resist. At 78 years young, my mom is still serving others with uncommon grace and love. When a cry for help is sent out, my mom doesn't think twice. She just races to the rescue...well maybe more like gently undertakes the solution.

My mom's service to others is drawn directly from scriptures. "God has given each of you a gift from his great variety

of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another. Do you have the gift of speaking? Then speak as though God himself were speaking through you. Do you have the gift of helping others? Do it with all the strength and energy that God supplies. Then everything you do will bring glory to God through Jesus Christ. All glory and power to him forever and ever! Amen" (1 Pt 4:10-11).

This is the same kind of servant heart I witness everyday here in the ministry of **Child Evangelism Fellowship®**.
